To ensure continuity of staffing at Federal beaches, and for other purposes.
1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4 This Act may be cited as the "Safe Beaches, Safe
5 Swimmers Act''.
6 SEC. 2. ADEQUATE LIFEGUARD STAFFING AT FEDERAL
7 SWIMMING AREAS AND BEACHES.
8 (a) In General.—If the Secretary determines there

9 is a staffing shortage with respect to a designated swim

1	location, the Secretary shall seek to enter into an agree-
2	ment with one or more local government agencies to enable
3	lifeguards employed by those local government agencies
4	to—
5	(1) adequately staff such designated swim loca-
6	tion during normal seasonal operating hours; and
7	(2) ensure visitor safety and provide rescue and
8	first aid services at the designated swim location as
9	necessary.
10	(b) Reimbursement.—
11	(1) In general.—In entering into an agree-
12	ment under subsection (a), the Secretary shall en-
13	sure that the local government agency providing the
14	lifeguard services is reimbursed for all reasonable
15	costs incurred by the local government agency in
16	carrying out the agreement.
17	(2) Current agreements.—If an agreement
18	has been entered into by the Secretary and a local
19	government agency for lifeguard services at a des-
20	ignated swim location on or before the date of the
21	enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall amend
22	such agreement as necessary to provide for the reim-
23	bursement of the local government agency for all
24	reasonable costs incurred by the local government
25	agency in carrying out the agreement, regardless of

1	the terms of the original agreement relating to cost
2	sharing.
3	(c) Definitions.—In this section:
4	(1) Designated Swim location.—The term
5	"designated swim location" means a swimming area
6	or swimming beach—
7	(A) on lands and waters managed by the
8	National Park Service, the United States Fish
9	and Wildlife Service, the Bureau of Land Man-
10	agement, or the Bureau of Reclamation; and
11	(B) that is typically monitored by federally
12	employed lifeguards during normal seasonal op-
13	erating hours.
14	(2) Staffing shortage.—
15	(A) IN GENERAL.—The term "staffing
16	shortage" means a level of staffing that nega-
17	tively impacts the ability to adequately staff a
18	designated swim location with federally em-
19	ployed lifeguards and will likely result or has
20	resulted in a designated swim location being left
21	unmonitored by federally employed lifeguards
22	during normal seasonal operating hours.
23	(B) Exclusion.—The term "staffing
24	shortage" does not refer to short-term staffing

1	shortages caused by temporary absences, such
2	as an employee taking annual or sick leave.
3	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
4	the Secretary of the Interior.
