



Fiscal Year 2027 Appropriations Guidance

Community Project Funding Requests

The House Appropriations Committee announced that the Committee will accept requests for Community Project Funding (CPF) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2027. This allows Members of Congress to request funding for specific projects in their districts in order to serve the public good. This process also ensures that taxpayers get a say in allocating funding that has a direct impact on their communities.

The House Appropriations Committee has placed new restrictions and guidelines on the CPF program and intends to fund community projects on a limited basis in the FY 27 appropriations bills. Each office will be allowed to submit a total of 20 CPF requests across all eligible accounts and those that address the most significant needs of the community are more likely to be included although there is no guarantee that all 20 CPF requests will be included in the FY 27 appropriations bills.

Only eligible CPF requests that meet all the guidelines established by the Committee will be accepted:

- You must be able to demonstrate that the request has community support. This requirement is integral for a successful CPF request, but it is flexible. Acceptable examples of community support include letters from elected officials, press articles, newspaper editorial board pieces, a state-intended use plan or community development plan, or a city council resolution.
 - Proof of community support should be included as a separate attachment in your application or readily available (24 hour turn around) if your project is selected.
- The project or requesting entity must have no financial ties to the Member or his family.
- Funding must be for FY 27 only.
- If the project would normally require a funding match or cost share by a non-federal entity, then the requesting entity will need to demonstrate that it can provide this match if it makes a CPF request. The Committee will conform to statutory match and cost-sharing requirements.
- The recipient of the CPF must be a governmental entity or 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. Requests made by for-profit entities are not permitted.

Please try to provide all information requested. Leaving blanks may lower your request's chance of success.

Email completed form to: FL23appropriations2@mail.house.gov by March 9, 2026. Our office needs time to process applications and collect any additional information needed before the Committee's first submission deadline of March 13, 2026.

House Offices have been provided with additional guidance based on the Subcommittee the CPF will go through. While the guidance is designed for Member submissions, we ask that you review the appropriate Subcommittee document to better build your application.
