



Blood Pressure MATTERS Act

The Blood Pressure MATTERS Act addresses maternal morbidity and mortality by requiring Medicaid, CHIP, and commercial health insurers to provide pregnant and postpartum moms blood pressure monitoring devices, without cost sharing with the patient.

High blood pressure during pregnancy carries significant risks for the mother and baby, including preeclampsia, placental abruption, and premature birth. Rates of gestational hypertension are higher among Black and Native American mothers, contributing to racial health disparities and the Black maternal mortality crisis.

Hypertension during pregnancy can lead to harmful outcomes for the pregnant person and baby. High blood pressure can limit blood flow to the placenta, slowing fetal growth, contribute to placental abruption, and premature delivery

To address gestational hypertension, this bill will provide the tools pregnant people need to monitor their health at home and seek the care they need.
