Dear Inspector General Grimm and U.S. Comptroller General Dodaro:

I am writing to formally request that you consider an investigation into the failed federal response to the monkeypox outbreak, which has had a disproportionately destructive impact on the LGBTQ community. The US has a long and ugly history of ignoring the public health needs of the LGBTQ community. For many in the community, history is repeating itself.

When there is an infectious disease outbreak, the federal government has an obligation to make vaccines, therapeutics, and diagnostics immediately and widely available. Instead of acting with a sense of urgency, both the CDC and FDA moved at a bureaucratic pace, enabling the virus to spread uncontrollably for two months. A highly containable virus has thus been rendered uncontainable by inexplicable delays in distributing both tests and vaccines. Indeed, even though the US had at its disposal more than a million doses of the Jynneos vaccine—in a plant in Denmark, able and ready to be deployed at a moment's notice—the FDA took two months to approve the distribution of those doses, allowing the virus to entrench itself as a sexually transmitted infection in the meantime.¹

As of July 15, 2022, there are 12,556 reported cases of monkeypox throughout the world, with about 1,500 cases coming from the United States.² New York State alone accounts for a third of reported cases in the US, and the reported cases are likely a fraction of the actual number. ^{3 4}
