A BILL

To amend the Keep Kids Fed Act of 2022 to extend additional reimbursement rates for certain child nutrition programs, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Helping Schools Feed
- 5 Kids Act of 2023".

1	SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF REIMBURSEMENT RATES.
2	(a) Breakfasts and Lunches.—Section 2(a)(3) of
3	the Keep Kids Fed Act of 2022 (42 U.S.C. 1753 note)
4	is amended—
5	(1) by striking "only"; and
6	(2) by striking the period at the end and insert-
7	ing "and the school year beginning July 2023."
8	(b) CACFP Meals.—Section 3(a) of the Keep Kids
9	Fed Act of 2022 (42 U.S.C. 1766 note) is amended—
10	(1) in paragraph (1), in the heading, by strik-
11	ing "FOR 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR"; and
12	(2) in paragraph (2)—
13	(A) by striking "only"; and
14	(B) by striking the period at the end and
15	inserting "and the school year beginning July
16	2023."
17	SEC. 3. RESEARCH AND IMPLEMENTATION OF REPORT
18	RECOMMENDATIONS.
19	(a) In General.—The Secretary of Agriculture (in
20	this section referred to as the "Secretary") shall, in ac-
21	cordance with subsection (b), research or implement the
22	recommendations contained in the Child Nutrition Report-
23	ing Burden Analysis Study (commissioned by the Food
24	and Nutrition Service of the Department of Agriculture
25	pursuant to House Report 114–531).
26	(b) Activities.—The Secretary shall—

1	(1) implement, on the publicly available website
2	of the Food and Nutrition Service, a user-friendly,
3	single location for all guidance and policy materials
4	provided to States and school food authorities by the
5	Food and Nutrition Service of the Department of
6	Agriculture;
7	(2) create and submit to Congress a plan to re-
8	structure or simplify the school meal eligibility proc-
9	ess, including—
10	(A) research on—
11	(i) the impact of using a unified
12	school meal application form; and
13	(ii) the use of census tract data on
14	poverty levels for verification of eligibility
15	under the Richard B. Russell National
16	School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1751 et seq.)
17	and section 4 of the Child Nutrition Act of
18	1966 (42 U.S.C. 1773); and
19	(B) recommendations for legislative
20	changes needed to implement such plan;
21	(3) create and submit to Congress a plan that
22	includes recommendations for legislative changes
23	that would allow school food authorities that serve
24	fewer than 100 students and residential child care
25	institutions to receive food from the USDA Foods in

1	Schools program (or cash in lieu thereof) without
2	participating in the school lunch program under the
3	Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42
4	U.S.C. 1751 et seq.); and
5	(4) consolidate duplicative information requests
6	across management evaluations and financial man-
7	agement reviews, while ensuring the purposes of
8	both such reviews are met.
